



With the 2022 football season finally upon us, who better to run the rule over who's in, who's out and who's the team to beat than the 3SH Central Murray Live commentary team.

**Shane Fleming – O**kay guys, the new season is upon us, what are we all looking forward to?

**Noel Watson –** The big thing I'm looking forward to is getting the footy and netball communities together again. The poor kids have been stuck at home with school and I think this year presents an opportunity for people to get back out and socialise again

Glenn Stewart - Same here Noel I'm looking forward to the whole interaction of the clubs getting back together again and just seeing how they respond. There's so many people who haven't been able to do that with COVID and with the impacts of

Brian Mansbridge - Personally, I'm just looking forward to having a bit of freedom and normality back at the footy – just getting back to normality watching some good footy, interacting with

GS - And walking up to the canteen and get a pie

BM - Yeah, that too! But just be able to interact with the players, coaches and supporters again, because I think we've all missed that social aspect and that ability to interact with others.

NW - The headache we have right at this moment,

though is with the umpires - or a lack of them. There's a huge shortage at the moment.

SF - Well, what's the alternative? Clubs are just going to have to umpire themselves aren't they?

 ${\bf NW}$  – The difficulty is do you umpire your own club? Or do you have, for instance, the Lake Boga umpire go and umpire Balranald? You couldn't possibly ask that, because otherwise they may as well be official umpires.

**BM** – It can go the other way sometimes. If you're a fair dinkum umpire, you'll be harder on your own team because you don't want people sitting on the boundary line abusing you.

**NW** – I'd love to see all the sides that were right up there last year in both the football and netball, finish right up there again. You'd love to see the Balranald A-grade netballers finish at the top again. You don't want to see them get so close and then drop back down the ladder again.

GS - Talking of the teams who have finished at the top last year, what's happening with recruits? Have Kerang picked up a few?

BM - They've picked up Nick Stagg and Lachie Ross. Stagg is a damn good player – he will run

rings around blokes up here.

**NW** - Cohuna were up there last year, too - have they recruited anyone?

SF - They've picked up Jarrod Findlay, Tom Metherell, Ben Archard as their ruckman, so they've fixed up their one Achilles heel from last year, and Brenton Conforti.

**BM** – Conforti is a really good pick-up – he played Interleague footy for Bendigo not long ago, he will absolutely dominate up here. But of all those players you've said that come from Bendigo, Nick Stagg is well above them.

**NW** - How old is he now?

BM - He'd be in his early 30s, I'd reckon. He's a hard nut, he is as tough as any footballer going around. Findlay is a very good player, he's classy, moves the ball, can run and will probably play in the centre, but Stagg has him covered - if he doesn't come off with his head bandaged up every week, then there's something wrong.

**NW** – I'll tell you something that may have been glossed over to a degree and that's kids that haven't played a lot of football over the last two seasons are all of a sudden going to be pushing for seniors. There's 17 and 18-year-olds that people will all of a sudden say "who the hell is this kid, where'd he come from?" The other thing is some clubs are going to need to play them, because with the points system, you can't bring eight players in all in one season anymore.

GS - Boga have picked up a couple of pretty handy players. Their ruckman who's from up north, Jacob Simpson, is a very, very good player – and they've picked up Josh Filo as well, who's the brother of Matt. The two brothers have never really played football together apparently, so that will be great to see. Josh is the older of the two and he's bringing with him Daniel Dzufer, I think he's a centre half back and was on the Brisbane Lions list at one point, too.

**NW** - Isn't it hard to know just how good a side's going to be? Especially if they can recruit three good players that takes the pressure off three players from the year before who had to play a key role all of a sudden, they become even better players.

**GS** – John Harvey is another interesting one for Boga. I rated him pretty highly last season and apparently he's had a pretty big pre-season. I'm not saying Boga will play finals, but they'll definitely improve

**NW** – I think one of the most important things this year will be the reserves and the depth at each club

**BM** – See, that's where your Kerangs and Cohunas will be at an advantage, because they do have depth in their reserves. If a player can't play because of COVID or injury, then their next best player isn't going to be too bad. Whereas some of these outlying clubs probably don't have the same depth to call upon.

**GS** – Tooleybuc-Manangatang, everyone's saying they've recruited heaps, but is there any quality amongst them?

SF – Yeah, they've picked Brayden Pitcher from Tassie who looks like a handy type, as does Shylo Smith who's won an EDFL Division 1 league medal. Outside of them, they've got a couple of locals coming back like Alex Powell and the Grant brothers. They'll improve, but I think the big question is how much they'll improve with Dean Helmers coaching them.

**GS** – Is Kal Heslop returning to Swan Hill?

SF - Yep, he's back.

**GS** – Yeah, he's a good player. He'll be handy deep forward for them and will give them the target they missed last season.

**SF** – Tyntynder have recruited pretty heavily with Josh Stone taking the reins, how are they going to go?

BM - I reckon they'll make the five.

**GS** – Depends on how Jason Eagle goes, I suppose. He's getting on in years a little bit, but he can bloody play!

**NW –** I reckon they'll be in that little mid-tier group, around that fifth-sixth bracket.

**BM** – Yeah, I reckon there's that middle tier and they'll be in that – but I reckon they'll be at the upper level of that bracket. Stone is a good player, so if he comes in and he's fit and getting a kick, that will ease the pressure off those couple of good young midfielders they have.

**GS –** Have they got a ruckman? Because I think Smillie has left, hasn't he?

BM - What about Ellis?

**SF** – Ellis has gone to Sea Lake and Smillie has gone back to Melbourne, but they have picked up Tate Hulland from Ouyen, who played in the ruck over there last season.

**NW** – They need another couple of big bodies down back still. I know the guys they have down there are good, but they aren't quite big enough against the monster forwards like Rhys Free and Dylan Johnstone.

**GS** – When they run the footy though, they are quicker than most sides and they look good.

**SF** – What about the Mallee Eagles, where are they at?

GS - The jury is still out with them, I think.

**BM** – I've heard reports that they've lost Saad and Hickman and a couple of others but then they've picked up a couple, but they've been pretty quiet this off-season.

**NW** – The problem that they've had in the past is their forward line and being able to kick enough goals to win them the game.

**SF** – They've picked up Sam Dunstan from Hepburn, so I think he'll certainly help them in that regard.

**GS** – And McKenzie comes back too, but he had that horrific leg injury a few years ago. He did play at Charlton last year and he played pretty well from all accounts, so he will help thewwm improve, too.

SF - Swan Hill, same question?

**BM** – I think they're in the same boat as the Eagles.

**NW** – I think they're one of those clubs that's saying: "You know what, if we finish between fourth to seventh, then that's a good year for us".

**BM** – I'm thinking Woorinen, Mallee Eagles, Swan Hill, Tyntynder, Balranald are all in that mid-tier third to seventh bracket – and not necessarily in that order either, mind you.

**NW** - Raiders?

**GS** – The bloody Raiders – in that Prelim Final out at Boga in 2019, they should have won that game and should have gone into the Grand Final and they could have won it all. Then COVID hits and they came back last year and were bloody terrible – and they were basically only missing Tom May and Tom Lamb from that side. Sure, they were great players, don't get me wrong, but they should have been better last year.

**NW** – But Stewy, that was three years ago now. That was 2019, this is 2022. A lot's changed since then

**GS** – Have they recruited anyone?

**SF** – They've picked up players mostly out of Melbourne, because that's where their new coach Aaron Collins is from. The ludica brothers, Jordan and Lucas, who'll play in the midfield and Josh Hale who is a centre half back. But they've lost O'Dwyer, Huntly, Smith and Arnold, so they'll leave big holes to fill.

**BM** – Smith is a big loss for them, I rated him highly.

**NW** – It's going to be a lot of fun this season, isn't it?

**GS** - Sure is, I can't wait.

BM - Bring it on!

There's a buzz around Balranald ahead of the new season – and an expectation that something special might be just around the corner for a team whose last finals appearance was all the way back in 2010.

The hype around the Roos is all centred on the return of one of their favourite sons, Jydon Neagle – and the son of the much-loved premiership coach, Merv – who has returned to town to co-coach Balranald alongside last year's senior coach, Ben Mahon.

While the inclusion of Neagle will not only help

from both a leadership and on-field perspective, the Roos will also be buoyed by an influx of former locals, returning to help the club attempt a return to their glory days. Former Balranald best and fairest Ryan Middlebrook is back, along with his brother, Shane – and will join former locals James Wray, Nash Fitzgerald, Ned Lay and Jordan Weekly back at the club.

With Balranald re-entering a Colts team in the Central Murray and with the stellar form of their A Grade netball side last season, the immediate future is looking bright, according to joint coach Mahon.

"The buzz around the club has been huge, especially since Jydon moved to town with his family – there's always people at footy training, all the club stalwarts are coming down for a look – and it's only pre-season," Mahon said. "There's been a real focus this pre-season on getting guys who are either from Balranald or have played here in the past back – number one, they're here for the right reasons and number two, they're less points as well (under the player points sytem)."

"We're really focusing on local youth and fast, quick ball movement and young blokes who can run."

While the addition of an elite footballer such as Neagle should see a sharp rise in the Roos' competitiveness, the real improvement will need to come from the continued development of their younger players.

Drew Lloyd took big strides forward and looms as the logical partner for Ben Fuller in attack. The other strength will be through the middle of the ground, with a settled on-ball division.

The Roos have managed to retain the services of Waratahs ruckman Jordan Wilkins. The big man is set to give the likes of Cam Barrett, Colin Andrews, Harrison Soraggi and both Tom and Jack Salau, an armchair ride around the stoppages.

The one area of concern for Balranald will be in defence, with the loss of Ryan Hodgson (full back) and Tom Burnside (centre half back). "We should improve – we're just worrying about what we can control and we think we're certainly going to be better," Mahon said. "We did pretty well all things considered last season, so if we can build off that and keep building for the next couple of years, then hopefully finals aren't too far away."

#### FROM THE COACH

"We'll certainly be hoping to play finals. We were only a couple of games out last season, so if we improve, then that will be the aim. All in all though, the main aim is to just keep improving and developing and building for the future of the club."

#### **PLAYER TO WATCH**

**Colin Andrews –** One of the barometers for Balranald, Andrews can dominate a game either through the midfield or up forward. Won the Roos' best and fairest last season – and will be an extremely important player for Balranald once again.



#### FEW teams enjoyed as successful a 2021 season as the Balranald Roos.

The A-Grade team and the Under-18s team were crowned the sporting teams of the year for their town, while A-Grade playing coach, A Grade best and fairest as well as Voyage Fitness Netball Coach of the Year Jess Parry took home the sportsperson of the year award.

Parry's side topped the ladder but were unable to compete in the grand final as COVID-19 reared its ugly head again. Another successful Roo was Grace Morton, and the Central Murray Football Netball League Under-16 best and fairest was awarded for her efforts with the town's young sportsperson of the year award.

This year again, Parry will take on a coaching role, teaming up with another star from the club, Stevie Bibby, to guide the A-Grade to what will likely be another strong season. Bibby will also team up with Taylin Barry to coach A-Reserve.

While the B and B-Reserve coaches are yet to be confirmed, Parry will also coach the Under-18 side, while Amelia Calleja will coach the under 16s with assistance from Deb Finch, while Finch will coach Under-14s with assistance from Calleja. The Under-12s coaching will be a team effort, with Macy Lloyd, Bonnie Jolliffe, Bree Hodson, Tegan Bruton and Mollie Helgeland stepping up. "It's really exciting to be getting back into netball season and a bit of normality again," Parry said.

The club is hard at work prepping to return to the courts, with fitness front of mind.

"Our pre-season has consisted of Tuesday and Thursday night trainings in Balranald along with a fortnightly session at Specialised Fitness," Parry said.

Parry hoped this work would allow Balranald to recreate 2021's success, "finishing on top of the ladder and seeing a new group of girls grow and achieve so much throughout a very interrupted season".

Unfortunately for the side, Hannah Morton has headed off to Geelong for university so that will be a big loss both on and off court. "Saying that, it opens up a position for another young talent to come through which is very exciting for us," Parry said.

The Cohuna Kangas will be out to prove they are the real deal once again in 2022, as they continue to push for their club's first senior's premiership since joining the Central Murray league 25 years ago.

The Kangas were primed for a tilt at the flag 12 months ago, with the return of a number of talented locals signalling their intent to go all out in order to break the drought. Unfortunately, COVID had other plans, wiping out the season with Cohuna sitting on top of the ladder.

The Kangas have once again left no stone unturned in their quest for that elusive piece of silverware, bolstering a couple of perceived weaknesses and adding considerable talent to their playing list. Ben Archard will return to his home club and is set to take over the ruck duties after winning the Darwin Buffaloes best and fairest over the summer – on top of having spent the past four seasons at Melton in the Ballarat Football League, where he also won two club best and fairests. Although Archard has been signed to Essendon's VFL list as a Covid top up player, it's still expected he will spend the bulk of the season at Cohuna. Archard won't be the only big-name recruit to don the purple this season, with the Kangas also securing the services of former Cheatley Medallist Jarrod Findlay and his Eaglehawk teammate and key defender Brenton Conforti, as well as threetime North Bendigo premiership defender Tom Metherell

While Jackson Williams, Sam Leitch and Xavier Mitchell have all departed, Neil Bradley is confident that his side will once again improve.

"Defensively, I think we've improved our side with just our general run from half back and strengthening our defence – we'll be aiming to move the ball through the middle and get it as quickly as possible into our forward line," Bradley said.

"I think most teams roll up behind the ball now, but we're placing a big emphasis on moving the ball with speed.

"I think our midfield and half back line will be a major strength - we're going to launch from there so we've tried to beef up our half back line. If we can win the ball first, we'll be hard to beat. While Bradley is keen to point out his team's defensive strength, it's the midfield that will hold a lot of opposition coaches' attention - particularly with the likes of Joel Helman and Tom Toma streaming out of the centre square.

The Kangas have plenty of depth in their on-ball division as well, with Tyson Findlay, Jack Donat, Sam McGlone and Riley Hird all capable of running through the midfield, along with recruit Jarrod Findlay. The other major strength that Bradley has at his

disposal is his forward line, with twin towers Rhys Free and Dylan Johnstone both posing a serious aerial threat, along with goal sneak Tyler Jones and Daniel Coates But while Cohuna have done everything they

possibly could have to once again put themselves in a position to challenge, Bradley knows the hard work is yet to come.

"Everyone's excited around the club, they know what's in front of them, but they also know how hard it is to achieve the ultimate - there's no illusions there that we are going to turn up and be a good side like last season, because I think a lot of other clubs will improve too," Bradley said.

"But we've got great leaders in Toma, Helman and Rhys Free – they've played a lot of good footy and they know what's required to win."

Kerang will be looking to return to the glory years of the early-mid 2010s after a much-improved showing in 2021.

Troy Coates will return as co-coach, with Bryce Curnow joining him in the hot seat following his impressive debut season in the Central Murray Football Netball League last year.

The Blues finished the last season in third place with eight wins and two losses, but were widely considered as one of the teams to beat with their damaging midfield and match winners on every line. While last season saw Kerang return to their assertive best, the likelihood is that they will be stronger again when the new season gets underway, with very few departures and a number of big-name recruits.

Sandhurst premiership pair Nick Stagg and Lachlan Ross headline those inclusions, with Stagg expected to slide straight into an already strong midfield and Ross likely to continue his love affair with half back – where he was crowned Sandhurst's best and fairest last season.

Also donning the navy-blue jumper will be a pair of Golden Rivers young guns in Nullawil's Rylee Smith and Wandella's Rylee Gitsham – with the new recruits certainly bringing with them an expectation of further improvement, according to Coates.

"We'd like to think that we'll improve – on paper were probably a ten to twenty per cent better side, which on the back of last year is a good position to be in," Coates said.

"But we are an older group as well, so we've just got to make sure the boys are doing the work and we're able to keep the boys on the park – we had a horrid run with injuries last year, but we're certainly happy with our recruiting and our list."

"Our midfield depth will be our biggest strength, with guys like Sam Heavyside, Marty Kelly, Josh Nitschke, Stagg, Gillingham, Brad Pay, we bat pretty deep through the middle, really – we've got seven or eight quality footballers that can roll through there."

While the Blues built their years of premiership success on their dominant on-ball division, perhaps the most important player ahead of the new season is ruckman Troy Davis, who after a number of injury-plagued seasons appears to finally have his body right.

While Kerang appear to have a team capable of going all the way, they will also need to have an eye on the future, with Coates and Curnow needing to strike a balance between developing the next generation, but also staying competitive with their ageing list and midfield.

This will see a few positional changes through the early stages of the season, with Josh Nitschke likely to spend more time in the midfield, along with Sean Hunter and Smith – with the likes of Marty Kelly and Ryan Gillingham to spend more time across half back and up forward.

"We are getting an ageing list, a lot of our key players are all getting to 30 and above so it's time for the next wave to come through," Coates said.

"Josh Nitschke is a prime example – he'll probably start in the midfield for us in round one, he's taken

Their first match this coming season will certainly test them as they face the strong Swan Hill in an away match, but the Blues are a powerful team in their own right. The River Raiders will be on the rebuild this season, with a new coach looking to return the tri-colours the top of the ladder after a disastrous 2021.

Aaron Collins will take over the reins from club legends Shane Guerra and Dean McGowan and comes to the club with an extensive coaching resume in the northern suburbs of Melbourne with the Jacana and Reservoir football clubs.

Koondrook-Barham will be coming from a long way back, after winning just two games last season – and although there's a lot of work to do, there is an air of expectation around the club under the new leadership structure, according to Collins.

"There's a bit of a buzz around at the moment, which is good - I think everyone's looking forward to getting back out on the ground, especially after the last couple of years," Collins said.

"Everyone's really enjoying the new structures that the coaching staff are trying to implement which is a positive as well."

"From a personal standpoint, I'm just really excited and can't wait for the season to get underway – there's a special group of players there and I just can't wait to see what we're capable of come round one."

Collins brings with him a number of new recruits and has clearly identified the River Raiders midfield as an area in need of bolstering, with the ludica brothers – Jordan and Lucus – signing on for 2022, along with Westmeadows run-with player Tom Peterson.

Unfortunately for Koondrook-Barham, they've also suffered some significant departures, with big-bodied midfielders Kal Huntly and Phil Smith moving on, along with key forwards Jay Reynolds and Cam Arnold and crafty goal sneak Matt O'Dwyer. While the loss of the experienced quartet will hurt, the Raiders have managed to retain the bulk of their talented, local youth – led by reigning seniors Best & Fairest Jake Dick-O'Flaherty and high-flying key forward Kye Attwell.

With two or three seasons of regular senior football under their belts, expect to see big improvement from the likes of Clay Davis, Jack Shannon, Bailey Laursen and Kade Watts, along with the continued development of exciting forward/midfielder Dominic Dick-O'Flaherty.

With such a young list at his disposal, development will certainly be a key focus this season for the Raiders new coach.

"There will be an emphasis on youth no doubt – even with the colts, there's some really good, talented kids in there that we'll be looking to give

opportunities to throughout the season," Collins said.

"The next generation at any club is important and you need to give them opportunities to develop." "In terms of where our on-field strengths will be, I would say that would be with our defence and through the midfield – we've done a lot of work with the boys down back and it all starts in defence"

On paper, Collins certainly appears to be right, with his team possessing a very settled and strong back six. Josh Hale, another recruit from Westmeadows, will step into the key defensive post at centre half back, while the evergreen Matt Dean will return for another season. It's also hoped that attacking half back Jaryd Wishart is over his injury issues, while swingmen Colin McVeigh and Max Baldissera could fill a role at either end of the ground

Lake Boga will be hoping the small steps forward they took last season become big strides as they look to make their first Central Murray Football Netball League finals appearance since 2010.

Despite finishing the 2021 season in 10th with a 2-8 win-loss record under new coach Shawn Filo, there were clear signs towards the end of the season that better times are not far away. Now, with another 12 months under the tutelage of Filo, Lake Boga may finally be ready to start that climb up the ladder that they've been desperately searching for over a decade to achieve.

Joining Filo as co-coach this season will be former Essendon and Port Adelaide forward Angus Monfries, who had an immediate impact for the Pies last season with 22 goals. With Monfries leading the way on the field and Filo taking the reins off it, Lake Boga appear to have the perfect coaching structure in place to guide their young squad.

With their junior teams having played off in multiple Grand Finals prior to COVID, the club was well placed to bring through the next generation of black and white champions, according to club president Joe O'Reilly.

"This year we had nine players come out of the Colts and play senior footy and of those nine, we retained eight of them," O'Reilly said.

"There's a positive feeling around the club with our youth at the moment – we've got four or five of them going away to school and they're wanting to return each week and play here, which is a huge endorsement in the direction of our club."

While Boga will continue to head down the youth path, they have also given their senior list a big boost with some targeted recruiting. Josh Filo comes to the club to link with his brother Matt (and dad Shawn) and will be a crucial addition to the Magpies' midfield rotations.

But perhaps the biggest recruit – literally – will be ruckman Jacob Simpson, who like Filo, comes to the club from Maroochydore. Simpson comes the club with a solid reputation, having won back-to-back club best and fairests as well as making the QAFL Team of the Year in 2021. Lake Boga have also strengthened their key position stocks at both ends of the ground, with Caloundra Panthers Daniel Dzufer set to fill the role at centre half back and Tyle Williams to play at centre half forward.

"We were struggling a little bit at one point with our recruiting, we'd lost Matthew Crooks and we needed a ruckman, so Shawn (Filo) rang Josh (Filo) and asked if he knew of anybody that might be interested in a change of scenery and he said he wouldn't mind coming and playing and it just went from there," O'Reilly said

"Our ruck and on-ball brigade will be a big strength of ours now – Jacob Simpson comes to the club with big expectations, plus when you add the two Filos into the middle alongside some of our locals like Holmes-Brown and Taylor, I think we've got a midfield that can mix it with most teams."

#### FROM THE COACH

"We obviously had a bit of momentum towards the end of last year, so we'd like to build on that and push towards finals."

The Mallee Eagles will turn to homegrown talent as they look to win their club's first seniors premiership since 1996 - and the first in the Central Murray era.

The man entrusted with ending the drought is Brent Sheahan, who will take charge of the Eagles for the first time following the departure of Dean Helmers after last season. With Helmers having left the nest, so too have his former disciples in Zak Saad and Rex Hickman, and they leave a hole up forward.

To help fill that hole, the Eagles quickly swooped on one of the premier full-forwards in country Victoria, with Sam Dunstan from the Hepburn Football Club signing on for this season. Dunstan boasts an impressive resume, having booted 190 goals from 30 games for the Burras in the Central Highlands Football League – including 82 goals from just 11 games in 2021.

Dunstan's arrival will ease the pressure on Andrew McDonald, who was often forced to play a lone hand up forward last season, while the continued development of Zac O'Meara should give Brent Sheahan a dangerous threepronged attack - which is clearly music to the new coach's ears.

"We're going to have a pretty strong presence up forward this season, especially with a player of the quality of Sam (Dunstan) coming to the club," Sheahan said.

"Zac (O'Meara) is another one who we're expecting big things from - he had some really explosive bursts through the middle in the ruck last season, so he'll definitely be going through there at stages again, but his marking ability just provides us with a bit of x-factor as well, so I'd say he'll play predominantly forward." The Mallee Eagles have traditionally generated a lot of their attacking play from their defensive half of the ground – and with Jacob Wade, Ayden Tessari, Jack Shannahan and Sheahan himself once again suiting up, one can expect this trend to continue.

In order to take the next step, the Eagles' improvement will have to come from their midfield. The return of Angus McKenzie from Charlton will certainly provide the Mallee engine room with a boost, as when he's on song,

there is no better tap ruckman going around. Harry Allen, who has taken on the assistant coaching duties, will once again lead the way through the centre, while Toby Sheahan and Darcy McGregor will provide plenty of support around the stoppages - as will Brady Fordham, who returns to his home club fresh off winning Moulamein's seniors best and fairest last year. While the inclusion of Fordham and McKenzie will bolster the Eagles' on-ball division, the midfield will still be an area of focus for Sheahan and his new coaching staff.

"We're expecting big things from the boys in the midfield this year – it was one area of the ground where we got beaten at times last season, so it's an area of our game that we'll be looking to improve on," Sheahan said. "It all starts out of the middle and if we're able to get our hands on the ball first around the contest and get it deep forward, that will go a long way towards us being competitive."



Consistency is the key – or at least that's what Swan Hill will be anticipating when they begin their 2022 campaign in the coming days.

With the same coaching structure in place for the past two years (Matthew Wade and Darcy Ryan as co-coaches) and after retaining almost their entire playing list from last season, the Swans will be hoping stability and cohesion will give them a distinct advantage over their opponents – particularly in the early rounds of the season.

The by-product of maintaining their list from one season to the next will be an improvement in depth, with a number of talented juniors now pushing to play regular senior football also creating competition for spots, according to Swans co-coach Darcy Ryan.

"I think our depth will be a big strength of ours this season – keeping the same list together from last year will help with that and then with the younger guys coming through like Angus Monk, Max Dow, Hamish Robertson and the like, if the kids can continue to develop, then that will only improve further," Ryan said.

"We just don't know what we'll get from them at this stage. They're untapped really in terms of their talent and how much of an impact they will have at senior level."

The Swans will also be hoping for a better run with injuries, particularly to key players Xavier Moloney and Xavier Mertz – both of whom missed large chunks of last season.

Mertz should spend most of his time forward, playing the conduit role between half back and attack, while the 'Rolls Royce' Moloney will once again split his time between the forward line and the Swans engine room, along with two-time Jack Betts medallist and co-coach Matt Wade. While Swan Hill may not have had many departures – apart from Declan Quin – Ryan indicated that they will have one recruit that should make a big difference to their team structure

"We didn't really have that big key forward that can play deep and be that get-out option last season – it can be a bit deflating at times when you work hard to get the ball into your forward line and it then rebounds out pretty easily," Ryan said.

"But now with Kal Heslop returning, he'll either mark it or bring it to ground and help get our crumbing forwards into the game."

"The other positive is that it will push  $\operatorname{\mathsf{Mitch}}$ 

Makepeace out into the pocket and play a game that suits him more, instead of him being forced to play a key forward role."

The Swans back six looks solid on paper, with plenty of experience through the likes of Leighton Dullard, Tom Holdstock, Tom Corridan, Brendan Blackmore and Lachie Joyce – while last year's joint best and fairest in Oscar Lewis should only continue to improve and develop his game off the half back flank.

The other key player for Swan Hill will be the man who Lewis shared that honour with, Toby Thoolen. The big ruckman will once again don the maroon and white – and it will be his presence around the ground and his ability to give his onballers first use of the ball that may well decide how far the Swans go in season 2022

#### FROM THE COACH

"I'd like to think we'd be aiming at playing finals, especially on the back of not having lost anyone from last season. With a bit of natural progression from the younger players, we'll be pretty close to the mark."

Tyntynder will be a club to watch in 2022, with a new coach and a plethora of new recruits seeing the Doggies stake their claim as a potential finals contender.

In the past two seasons, (2019 and 2021) Tyntynder have been treading water in the middle of the ladder, finishing seventh (2019) and sixth (2021) with a 50 per cent winning record in both years. While that was achieved with a young and mostly homegrown team, the club has now looked outside their four walls in order to take that next step, with the appointment of two-time Woorinen premiership midfielder Josh Stone.

Stone, who was assistant coach at the Tigers for their 2018 premiership, has not only brought with him a wealth of knowledge, but also a winning attitude – something that he is hoping will rub off on his new club.

"There's been a bit of a buzz around the club since the start of the year, which has been good because they've been in the bottom half of the ladder for a few years now – hopefully with the guys that we've recruited, they can help complement the young talent that's already here," Stone said.

"In terms of coaching, I'm really enjoying the challenge – it's something I've enjoyed in the past and so far it hasn't been any different."

"Everyone's been really supportive which is a huge positive and I think all the players are just keen to get out there and show we are ready to take the next step."

While the Doggies have lost former coach Justin Ellis, who has departed for Sea Lake-Nandaly, and Dylan Smillie, who has returned to Melbourne – their arrivals have more than covered their departures

Adding some experience to their on-ball division was a clear focus after last season – and they have certainly achieved that with the recruitment of Ultima's Tom Bull, Andrew Bennett and Brodie Bennett, as well as Sea Lake-Nandaly's Kyle Brasser and Ben Hallam from Imperials.

Along with Marcus Wattie, Brodie Carroll, Isaiah Bull and the Sala brothers, Tyntynder now has an abundance of midfield depth that they can call upon – which will be needed as the season progresses, according to Stone.

"I think we're going to have enough hardness in there (the midfield) to make it a pretty contested game and just get the ball going our way," Stone said.

"It doesn't have to be pretty football all the time, sometimes you just have to be accountable and beat your opposition at the contest – we don't have

a heap of premium, elite midfielders, but we do have some hard, tough on-ballers and with that we just have to win it at the contest and get it out to some of our quicker players on the outside."

The biggest recruit to the kennel this season will be Jason Eagle, a multiple century goal kicker from Irymple, who looks set to be the dominant key forward that the Doggies have been crying out for in recent cases.

The only area of concern could be down back, where Tyntynder will be relying on Cayden Crowe, Patrick Crowe and Elliott Broad to control their opposition's main goal kickers – and while all three continue to develop into reliable key defenders, they could still be considered a little undersized against some of the competition's elite big key forwards.

#### **KEY GAME TO WATCH**

"I'd like to think that with who we've recruited and where the club finished last season that we'd be around the top four, or at least that's what we're striving for. Taking that next step is going to be the challenge, but I think there's enough talent there to do it."

#### **PLAYER TO WATCH**

Marcus Wattie – Had perhaps his best season in blue, white and red in 2021, finishing fifth in the Jack Betts Medal and leading Tyntynder's goalkicking, despite playing predominantly through the midfield. His speed from the contest and elite ball use makes him a must-stop player for any opposition team.

"His skill level has really impressed me throughout the pre-season – last year we pencilled him down in the backline, but don't be surprised if we swing him forward this season at stages as well."

"It's not just Henry though, there will be quite a few younger players getting an opportunity — like Matt King, Mitch Uhlhorn, Robert Rush, Matt Gardner, those young kids that are coming through that have had a taste of senior footy and are now ready to take that next step."

"We had seven players in the Bendigo Pioneers training squad, so there's seven kids there that should all be playing senior footy and having an impact."

Kicking a winning score certainly won't be an issue for Woorinen, with Doug Palmer and Eltringham set to form a potent combination up forward for the Tigers. Tom Isma will also return to help fill the small forward role, while both

McCartney and Elford are expected to rotate through deep forward at times.

"Later on in the season we struggled with our depth in the key positions – all it took was for a couple of injuries and our structure just fell apart, we just had to target and recruit in those positions," Moloney said.

Moulamein will no doubt have one of the strongest forward lines in the Golden Rivers this season, after adding Mathoura key forwards Callum Harding-Davies and Josh Flight, with Harding-Davies also set to take the reins of assistant coach for the Swans.

Together with Andrew Silva and Luke Smailes, who will both return, the quartet will no doubt pose significant headaches in front of the sticks. The challenge for Moloney will now be giving his potent forward half enough supply to hurt teams where it counts.

"We'll be playing a pretty aggressive brand of footy and we'll certainly be looking to take the game on with the forward line we've assembled," Moloney said.

"We've already had our forwards talking together and none of them care who kicks the goals – it's all about working as a team and getting the score on the board."

Development will be the buzz word in 2022 for a Murrabit team intent on investing in their juniors – and returning to finals action sooner rather than later.

"We'll be looking to run and create as much as we can, but we'll also have a big focus on team defence and trying to shut down our opposition and defend from higher up the field."



"She's only 17 years old but she deserves to go on to better."





It's been a long 39-year wait between drinks for Marong – but that may be all about to change if last season is any guide.

# The future of junior football is on the line

After two years of cancelled competitions and postponed matches, never has there been a more important time for grassroots football to shore up its future.

For our children, it's been a particularly hard 24 months. Home schooling, large slabs of time apart from their friends and having just about every social element of their lives shelved for the best part of two years.

But now, as we awake from our slumber and life begins to return to some level of normality, it's time to ask ourselves as a sporting community exactly how we proceed – and what is the best way to help develop the next generation and make up for lost time.

It's a question that AFL Victoria Participation Coordinator David Alderuccio has been pondering lately, especially in the wake of the long-term trend of declining numbers at junior levels. "There's a lot of factors that come into play there's COVID and the lingering effect from the pandemic, there's cost of living and there's also the fact that we are living in an area with a declining population – but I know from an AFL perspective, we want to be able to grow and develop participation and try and get as many kids as possible out there playing football, so it's a trend we need to reverse," Alderuccio said. 'The drop-off of kids between the ages of 10 and 14 that are not playing football is huge and we all need to work together to reverse this trend for the future of not only our clubs, but the sport itself." One big cause in the noticeable drop off of participation has nothing to do with the pandemic - and everything to do with the systemic, win-atall-costs attitude of clubs at junior level, according

"We need to make sure we retain them when we do get them into the game and there's a lot of things that myself and the clubs could be doing better with regard to player retention – it might be as simple as just having good coaches in place or even just making sure it's a fun and safe environment for everyone to enjoy.

"Ultimately, we just want to get kids back being active and not worrying about the scoreboard, not worrying about the results and who wins, just get them back playing sport, being around their friends, being in a community environment and back enjoying playing footy.

"At that level of competition, we shouldn't be focusing on winning - the result is irrelevant, we want kids to be developing and playing the best quality football that they can and for that, they all need to be getting an equal opportunity, no matter whether you're the first picked or the last." The by-product of clubs focusing on the result has often come at the expense of individual development - and it's a trend that's been getting more prevalent over the last decade or so. It's long been bemoaned at the elite development level, such as NAB League, that players present to them unable to play different positions on the ground because they've been pigeon-holed for years at club level as either a midfielder, forward or defender, because that's where their club coach feels that gives his or her team the best chance to win.

But Alderuccio says it time we changed that mindset to what's in the best interests of the individual.

"Coaches have to learn that by always playing the better kids in the more dominant positions on the ground, such as the midfield, that it's having a two-fold effect on their team," he said.

"Firstly, the player who only plays that one position becomes one-dimensional and stagnates in their development – and secondly, the other players who never get to touch the ball because they're playing on the periphery, they also don't get the opportunity to develop and they ultimately

stop playing.

"It's that attitude that just has to change - if you have a player who is a dominant onballer, then put them on a back flank or rotate the positions every quarter, because at junior level, whether it's Under 13s or Colts, it's all about learning and about encouraging those players to continually learn." It's not just a problem for coaches of junior teams either, with a similar trend appearing at the breeding ground stage with Auskick. Although the AFL's figures suggest the overall Auskick participation numbers last year were almost back to the same level of 2019 - pre-COVID - the trend that should alarm the game's powerbrokers most is when a child drops out of the Auskick program, they are then lost to the game – and community football

This trend is one that I can speak about from personal experience – as a father of three children (one daughter, two sons) who have all tried and spent multiple years in the Auskick program. All three tried Auskick at different clubs – and all had very different experiences – but there was one common thread, the opportunity to participate and therefore enjoy playing the game was lacking. Unfortunately, all three ceased their involvement in Australian Rules football following their second Auskick season and have since taken up different sports – much to their father's dismay.

"Auskick is a great program that most clubs have got right and unfortunately some kids will drop out for a variety of reasons – but the last thing we want to do is lose kids to the game because of areas we can improve on," Alderuccio said. "Particularly after COVID, it's important we get

"Particularly after COVID, it's important we get it right, because kids have played limited or no football over these last two years, their confidence has dropped and we really just want clubs to get back to the basics – bring it back to the kids just having fun and being around their mates and playing football for the love of it."

"But again, it comes back to focusing on winning at junior level affecting a child's enjoyment –

when we put winning as the priority ahead of development and enjoyment, we end up with clubs struggling to field teams."

But as with most junior sports, it's not just a problem for the coaches to resolve, but parents also need to heed the warnings, especially when it comes to elite-level development.

"For parents – and I really can't stress this enough – don't put too much pressure on them, kids will develop in different ways and in different age brackets, but putting too much pressure on kids at an early age is only counter-productive," Alderuccio said.

"Kids don't need to be standouts at a young age, because the goal and ambition of everyone involved should be to keep everyone playing football right throughout the junior grades, with the end goal being to have them playing senior football, be it male or female football."

So, what's the solution? How do clubs – and

coaches – reverse this trend and get our youth back playing this great game that's been around for over 160 years?

"It starts with getting the right coaches involved with your club," Alderuccio said.

"I understand there's a real issue with volunteer burnout at the moment and I commend everyone who is putting their hand up this season to volunteer their time to coach a team, but there needs to be more assistance given to their coaches by their clubs."

"The clubs need to be able to give them the right resources to learn and keep developing, not just give them the job and then let them do it – they need to support them as well."

"I think we also need to break this stigma of thinking that good footballers make good coaches – anyone can be a good coach if they're willing to put the time and effort into it."

"We often see players develop because of the leaders they have and I think it's really important that clubs get the right coaches in."

# AFLW model for the inaugural girls' season

THE local sporting landscape will this year take another step into the rapidly growing world of women's football, through the development of the first junior girls football competition in the Mallee and Wimmera regions.

The new competition will be run under the AFL Central Victoria banner, and is open to girls aged eight to 14, with the competition starting at Woorinen on Sunday, May 1, It will run for five weeks and the Grand Final is on Sunday, June 5. With the rise of female participation in football across the region in recent years, AFL Victoria Participation Co-Ordinator David Alderuccio said it was a logical next step to develop an all-female junior competition, and complete the pathway for girls to compete in the expanding AFLW. "It's a massive opportunity to bring female football to the region – but more importantly, we've seen a great opportunity for girls to play in a competitive environment and not only be part of a club, but then also represent that club,'

Alderuccio said.

"Obviously, it's been a long time coming, but in a really short turnaround, because we've just had so much interest in female footy – that's obviously come from the AFLW, but also from the other programs across the region that have been run."

Six clubs from across the Central Murray, Golden Rivers and North Central Football Netball Leagues have entered teams for the first instalment of the competition, with Woorinen, Swan Hill, Tyntynder, Birchip-Watchem, Sea Lake-Nandaly and the Warra Blues all forming inaugural teams.

"The only female competitions locally at the moment are either in Bendigo or in other major regional areas, so we thought we should open it up to any clubs within the three leagues and under the AFL Central Victoria banner was a wise option in order to promote participation," Alderuccio said.

"We thought let's just knuckle down and focus on the importance of participation in this first season, so we've incorporated a five-round competition where everyone will play each team once, which will then be followed by a Grand Final "

"It will be a bit similar to what the AFLW did in their first year – just a short, sharp competition where everyone gets the opportunity to play each other once and then hopefully, in the years to come, we'll be able to expand that out to a proper season, with more teams and more players." Games will be on Sundays, with each club getting the opportunity to host one round across the season, instead of the traditional home-and-away format.

"We've looked at a lot of different things in setting up this new competition and volunteer retention is one thing we looked at closely, along with the recruitment of players, in terms of making some of the decisions we have," Alderuccio said.

of the decisions we have," Alderuccio said.
"We've modified the rules and we've modified the number of players on the ground, which will make it easier for clubs to field teams and just get the

girls playing."
"All games will be played on a Sunday, which opens it up to any girls who play netball on Saturdays or any other sport that might want to

play in this competition as well."

"The other thing we are doing is holding all six clubs and all three games at the one venue on the same day – not only will this help create a bit of an atmosphere for the girls, but it also means clubs won't be overloading their volunteers by having to host more games of football on another day of the week."

Although the season is now just a month away, there is still plenty of time for any girls aged between eight and 14 to join, with all clubs holding come and try days.

While the competition is still at ground zero, it won't be long before it takes off.

"The feelings been really positive, we're starting to get some really good traction and I know the clubs are all working hard to recruit and hopefully, fingers crossed, this can just start," Alderuccio said. "Hopefully we can build on this foundation for years to come and get more clubs get involved – then, eventually, it'll be a matter for the leagues to work out what's the best structure for the competition."

"It's a hugely exciting time to be a part of women's footy in our region at the moment too – the pathway to women's footy and the AFLW is pretty clear and quick if you have ability – it's an exciting time to come and give it a go."





